

Vocabulary: **Air travel**

<b>aisle</b>	<i>n.</i> corridor in aeroplane between the seats [there are usually one or two]
<b>baggage claim</b>	<i>n.</i> place where passengers go to find their luggage (cases etc) at the end of a flight
<b>board</b>	<i>v.</i> to get on or enter an aeroplane - <b>on board</b> <i>adv.</i>
<b>boarding pass</b>	<i>n.</i> special ticket showing that passenger has checked in and may board plane
<b>check in</b>	<i>v.</i> to register for a flight, inc. checking of tickets, passports, luggage etc - <i>also n.</i>
<b>confirmation</b>	<i>n.</i> passenger's telephone validation of return reservation; reconfirmation
<b>departures board</b>	<i>n.</i> large display in airport showing times, destinations etc of departing flights
<b>domestic</b>	<i>adj.</i> national, not international [a domestic flight is entirely within one country]
<b>duty free</b>	<i>adj.</i> [of products: cigarettes, perfume etc] not taxable; exempt from customs taxes
<b>excess baggage</b>	<i>n.</i> luggage that is more than the permitted or allowed weight
<b>flight</b>	<i>n.</i> an aeroplane scheduled to fly a certain route at a certain time
<b>gate</b>	<i>n.</i> the point in an airport at which a particular flight arrives and departs
<b>hand luggage</b>	<i>n.</i> light bags, briefcases etc that may be carried on board by passengers
<b>IATA</b>	<i>abbr.</i> International Air Transport Association
<b>immigration officer</b>	<i>n.</i> government official responsible for checking passengers' passports
<b>jet lag</b>	<i>n.</i> extreme tiredness etc after a long flight between extreme time zones
<b>runway</b>	<i>n.</i> the strip on which planes land and take off
<b>stopover</b>	<i>n.</i> a break for a day or two on an international flight
<b>ticket</b>	<i>n.</i> receipt for transportation etc. An air ticket has one <b>coupon</b> for each journey
<b>transit</b>	<i>n.</i> A transit passenger is one stopping at an airport that is not his destination
